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# **THANKSGIVING**

Throughout the Bible, "Thanksgiving" for blessings is expressed as a theme. "Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise! (Psa 95:2). Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name!" (Psa 100:4). The Old Testament resounds with the people praising God (Psa 69:30); Israel had a history of giving thanks to God for the mercy and deliverance He showed (Psa 50:14, 23). In the New Testament, Jesus always PRAYED (giving thanks) before meals. "And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and said a blessing over them. Then he broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd" (Lk 9:16). At the Last Supper Jesus took bread and gave thanks and offered it to His Followers (1 Cor 11:24). As the day of thanks is referred by many as a holiday, please give some serious thoughts for this thanksgiving day of celebration. **Motive**. When giving thanks to God, our sole motive must be *pure gratitude*. Thanksgiving is just what it has always been: giving thanks! "You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God" (2 Cor 9:11). A "Thanksgiving Prayer" is not to be polluted or corrupted with selfish thoughts or subconscious appeal of manipulation. It is God's Blessings toward us as we partake in a whole-hearted fashion demonstrating our appreciation of His Love. "Let there be no filthiness nor foolish talk nor crude joking, which are out of place, but instead let there be thanksgiving" (Eph 5:4). **Knowledgeable.** Being grateful requires looking back, no matter how recent and acknowledging blessings for which we are thankful. "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God" (Php 4:6). Our culture is infatuated with the future with the results being thanksgiving is oftentimes neglected. To give thanks to God is to look backwards revealing His Love instead of looking forward to express the gratitude for the good things having entered into our lives. Comprehensive. We thank God for everything. Often, more is included in our giving of thanks because of His many Blessings. We are so blessed. God is to be thanked for our family, friends, housing, jobs and hundreds of abundant things. "For everything created by God is good, and nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving," (1 Tim 4:4). Giving God thanks should be a theme running through our lives in good times and bad because of His Providence. We must constantly demonstrate our appreciation of His Thoughtfulness in all possible ways. "saying, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen" (Rev 7:12). We must not become complacent/unappreciative. Let's show the indebtedness of His many, wonderful Blessings by giving thanks, appropriately to Him.



# **THANKSGIVING**Leviticus 7:11 – 15

# **INTRODUCTION:**

- 1. [We] look to the concept of "Thanksgiving" as seen from a Biblical perspective.
- 2. The 1<sup>st</sup> reference to "Thanksgiving" is in the description of the thanksgiving offering.
  - A. This offering is **NOT** just an ancient ceremony, **BUT** the true value of a thankful heart.
  - C. Through it, we learn how God expects us to practice thankfulness.
    - 1. Thanksgiving is a key ingredient of peace.
      - A. It is part of "the law of the sacrifice of peace offerings" (Lev 7:11).
      - B. It is necessary for the peace of God to rule in our hearts (Col 3:15).

### **BODY:**

# 1. MUST BE MADE FOR ALL THINGS

- A. The thanksgiving offering alluded to different items offered together (Lev 7:12, 13).
- B. As Christians, we are to "give thanks always for all things unto God" (Eph 5:20).

# 2. MUST BE MADE FOR THE WORST THINGS

- A. The thanksgiving offering included an offering of "leavened bread" (Lev 7:13).
  - 1. Leaven (yeast) is used for negative things: sin, false doctrine and evil events.
  - 2. To include in the thanksgiving offering: thankful for even the bad things in our life.
- B. [We] are to be thankful for even the worst things happening to us.
  - 1. "...glory in tribulations" (Rom 5:3); "take pleasure in infirmities" (2 Cor 12:10).
  - 2. [We] are to "count it all joy" when [we] fall into temptations (Jas 1:2).
- C. This kind of thankfulness separates the believer from the lost.
  - 1. Even the lost are thankful for those things they perceive to be good.
    - A. It takes [true] faith to be thankful for things in which [we] see **NO** good.

# 3. MUST BE AN OFFERING UNTO THE LORD

- A. Part of the offering was to be "an heave offering unto the Lord" (Lev 7:14).
  - 1. The priest stretch his hands toward heaven of presenting the sacrifice unto God.
- B. True thanksgiving is we direct unto God.
- C. God will accept the sacrifice of thanksgiving as a special offering (Heb 13:15, 16).

# 4. MUST BE OFFERED ON THE BASIS OF THE BLOOD

- A. The thanksgiving offering was offered with the sprinkling of the blood (Lev 7:14).
- B. The sprinkling of the blood was a type of the sacrifice of Christ on the cross (1 Pet 1:2).
- C. The blood of Christ is the foundation of all the thanksgiving of a Christian (2 Cor 9:15).

# 5. IS THE BASIS OF CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP

- A. The sacrifice of the Peace Offering was enjoyed as a fellowship meal (Lev 7:15).
- B. Thanksgiving draws us closer to God and to other saints (Psa 35:18).

# 6. MUST BE OFFERED FRESH EVERY DAY

- A. The sacrifice of the thanksgiving offering must be eaten the day it is offered; none may be left for another day.
- B. The act of thanksgiving must be a present practice.
  - 1. Yesterday's thanksgiving will **NOT** suffice for today and today's can**NOT** be held over for tomorrow.
  - 2. We must be thankful each day (Psa 118:24).
