


Undue Emphasis On Self Mk 8:34

"And when he had called the people *unto him* with his disciples also, he said unto them, Whosoever will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me" (Mk 8:34). The Bible has a lot to say about self and how one is to view thyself in relation to God and others. If one would follow God's teachings, one's attitude toward self would be what it should be and many problems would be solved and pressures eased. When one follows the course of the world and gives undue emphasis to self, one not only adds to their problems now, but also places their soul in peril. What are the problems one can expect one is self-centered? **Self-centeredness:** This occurs when a person is absorbed in self. No one enjoys this type of person. It is easy to see when others are self-centered. Sometimes, though, it is hard to recognize this same quality from within. **Self-conceit:** This is an exaggerated estimation of one's ability or powers, an overconfidence in self. When one is conceited, one is full of pride. God hates pride and resists the proud (Pro 16:18; Jas 4:6,10; Lk 18:14). We are not to think too highly of ourselves (Rom 12:3). Should not be boastful of their gifts despising others. Self-willed: This is stubborn, set on having one's own way. One person was Jonah. He knew the will of God but fled so he would not have to do it. The stoning of Stephen (Ac 7:51-53) were identified as "stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears" meaning they stubbornly clung to their self-will rather than submitting to the God's Will. One resists the Holy Spirit when one resists their teachings (Lk 11:13; Eph 1:13; 1 The 4:8). **Self-indulgence:** This is giving free course to one's passions and inclinations. This is a sin which leads one from God. Demas, who had once been a faithful disciple and a dedicated co-worker of the Apostle Paul, had forsaken the Lord and the apostle because he "loved" the present world and indulged himself in its pleasures (2 Tim 4:10). Demas made the opposite decision than Moses made (Heb 11:24-27).

Self-righteousness: This is being righteous in one's eyes [a trait of the Pharisees (Lk 18:9 -14; Rom 10:1-3)]. It prompted an accusation Jesus of eating with sinners (Mt 9:10-12). Notice how they could see everyone else were sinners but not themselves. To be pleasing to God, one must humbly acknowledge their sinfulness. **Self-satisfaction:** This is being pleased with who and what one is. The world seeks to instill this attitude in everyone. Great care is often taken so nothing will damage the self-image of children. The satisfied person has reached their goal. One has no other worlds to conquer, no loftier heights to scale and no greater work to do. Their journey can only be downward. On the other hand, one cannot establish bounds for the person who is not satisfied with oneself and their accomplishments. Sadly, even Christians are guilty of this sin. Their guilt is seen in acceptance of mediocrity in relation to Christ and their service to Him. Was not the church at Sardis

rebuked for their indifference (Rev 3:1f). Do not be self-satisfied. Be like Paul—always seeking to be better, always striving to do more (Php 3:13, 14; 1 Cor 10:12). Walk together in obedience. Do not allow these problems to exist in your life. The Apostle Paul put it this way, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Col 3:16). This becomes your guide and permits you to be molded in the image of Christ by denying self and living for Him. Are you willing to follow after Christ?
