Our Christian Example Galatians 2:20

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. Paul once sought to attain salvation by the works of the Law of Moses; however, that part of him had been crucified with Christ. It had been put to death. He no longer sought to live by himself, but by Christ who lived in him. He declared Christ lived in him through faith as he believed and trusted in Christ by obeying His Word. Christ was the Son of God who loved Paul and gave himself up for Paul (1 Cor 15:3).

"Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (1 Tim 4:12). Despise is to look down upon, disrespect, treat with contempt or lightly esteem. Paul urges Timothy not to let others despise him because of his youth. Timothy's age is unknown at this time. However, it is safe to say he was not a boy in his teens. At this time, he had been with Paul for about 15 years. He was a Christian and had proved himself of some maturity before could utilize his abilities. The Romans view of life was as this: childhood - 18 years, youth (18 - 40) and old age (began at 40). On the other hand, widows under 60 were considered younger (1 Tim 5:9, 11). It could be stated with great certainty, he was between 30 - 39 years old at this time. He was instructed to do what Paul had commanded even though he would be instructing older men; therefore, he, being a younger man, should live in such a way there could be no contempt for his age. He was to be example of Christian living to them that believe and in word and in speech. This would include daily living as well as teaching and preaching. Also, in manner of life and in his daily conduct means how he lives and in dealing with people. To be an example in love and should always seek to do good to men and never do them harm. He certainly should never be bitter, resentful, revengeful, hateful or refuse to forgive. Christian love is of the will. Being an example in faith and loyal to God and His Word. He should be stedfast in doing right according to God's Will and an example in purity. His actions are to be pure as well as his mind. He had to live a good moral life and have sincere motives for what he does. There is a story told of a Christian, high school Senior, who was honored as one of the best and brightest in his community because he provided a forceful demonstration of integrity. When his school team was given the word "auditorium" in a regional spelling bee, he glanced down to ponder his response and noticed the word was printed on the microphone stand. He called this to the attention of the judges who responded with a more difficult word. The young man did what he knew was right whether others noticed or not. We don't know when our actions may become an example to others — we are always on display. But, if we live each day to honor Jesus, our behavior will model His Righteous Life (Gal 2:20; 1 Jn 2:5, 6), no matter who is watching. Uprightness and honor should be goals for Christians of every age. Paul told Timothy:

As Christians, one of our goals in life should be to change the world around us for good while never allowing ourselves to be compromised — one person at a time (Ac 10:38; 1 Tim 4:16; 2 Tim 2:1, 2). Remember the old, Christian Spiritual Hymn by W. J. Kirkpatric:

O to be like Thee! blessed Redeemer,
This is my constant longing and prayer;
Gladly I'll forfeit all of earth's treasures,
Jesus, Thy perfect likeness to wear.
O to be like Thee! O to be like Thee,
Blessed Redeemer, pure as Thou art;
Come in Thy sweetness, come in Thy fullness;
Stamp Thine own image deep on my heart.

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"And hath put all *things* under his feet, and gave him *to be* the head over all *things* to the church, Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all" (Eph 1:22, 23).
