**FOOD FOR
THOUGHT**

BY OUR LOVE

A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all *men* know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another” (Jn 13:34, 35).

It was a relief when the traitor was gone (Jn 13:31-38). The Lord could speak freely of His love and of His Approaching Glory, expatiating on the shining tablelands, but not yet revealing even to Peter the dark ravine separating Him from them and the shadows He was already entering. Peter was most anxious to be with Jesus wherever He was. Life without Jesus seemed impossible as he relied upon His Strong Resolution to keep him faithful to Christ, but found it unavailing, as we have ourselves experienced many a time. Let us not vaunt in self-confidence what one will or will not do, but seek strength from the Lord. How little we know ourselves! Yet, the time would come when this ardent Spirit will be able to fulfill its vow through the Spirit of Pentecost, (Jn 21:18; 2 Pet 1:14).

In 1970, renowned author and philosopher, Francis Schaeffer published a little 35-page booklet entitled, The Mark of the Christian, in which he powerfully establishes love as the identifying characteristic of New Testament Christianity. He launches into his thesis by citing the words of Jesus who says, “By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another” (Jn 13:35).

While the forces of hatred are so clearly seen in the world around us, we must not be drawn into that way of thinking. On a personal level, we must “Never pay back evil for evil to anyone” (Rom 12:17). Why? Because the Bible says, “Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but *rather* give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance *is* mine; I will repay, saith the Lord” (Rom 12:19). “Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good” (Rom 12:21). The Apostle Paul goes on to describe governing authorities as established by God for the punishment of evildoers and encouragement of those who practice righteousness (Rom 13:1-3). We are thankful for those protecting us from harm; punishing those who practice wickedness.

Christians are not in a military crusade against the forces of hatred and revenge. But, we are in a Spiritual battle requiring firm resolve and resistance to the ideas and strategies of the devil (Eph 6:10-12). Where our religion is true, it will affect every relationship in life. But notice its duties are reciprocal. We must give on our side, just as we expect others to give. The first duty of children is *obedience*. They must be taught to obey because it is right and their conscience bears witness to this. Never *plead* with a child to do what is right nor *bribe* by a reward. Take your stand on the primeval sense of right and wrong, the foundation of morals and will be the stay of their whole after-life, once its supremacy is established. Parents should help their children by removing irritation or passion from their own speech. The center of all authority is Christ. He Will demand an account of our treatment of every servant He has sent into our homes.

Many are the battles individual disciples fight on a daily basis in their struggle to do what is right in the sight of God. We have a unique opportunity to show the world the substance of our faith as it is expressed in love. What a contrast between the practice of Christian love and the practice of religious and political hate designed only to terrorize others and subjugate all who stand in the way of their own desires.

It is unlikely that history will remember kindly those who opposed evil in the gentleness of Christian love. But, if such should one day occur, may we have the insight to give God the glory. After all, our love is but a reflection of the far-greater love bestowed on us in the person of Jesus Christ, our Lord (Jn 3:16; 1 Jn 4:19).
