THE IMPORTANCE OF HUMILITY

The Psalmist tells us God distances Himself from the proud (Psa 138:6). A proud look not only separates one from God, but causes one to incur His wrath! This is, undoubtedly, why James, the half-brother of Christ wrote, God has placed His Spirit within us (Jas 4:5) and yearns for obedience over our hearts. He can best overcome inordinate desire and teach us how to pray. "But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble" (Jas 4:6). God wants more of us. His love is insatiable in its yearning for every room and cupboard of our inner life. He is ever wishful to give more grace. But what is humility, really? What does humility demand, require, express and acknowledge?

James continues by saying, "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you" (Jas 4:7). Humility demands full submission to God. It's difficult to teach those who think they are so wise that they already know enough. Because He gives grace to the humble, God's people must put off their own desires and accept His law and love. This requires resisting Satan and his temptations to follow our own desires. That is what fully submitting to God means.

Let us have the Bible and eternity in our minds entirely adhering to sound Scripture in submission to God! James says, "Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse *your* hands, *ye* sinners; and purify *your* hearts, *ye* double minded" (Jas 4:8). Humility requires seeking God's favor and mercy. One who seeks His favor and a close relationship with Him must be willing to come to Him, for He does not force Himself upon men. This is a decision based upon an individual's faith and obedience. However, the key is WORK. It is not easy to cleanse our hands and purify our hearts, but that is what must be done.

Furthermore, James tells us we must "Be afflicted, and mourn, and weep: let your laughter be turned to mourning, and *your* joy to heaviness" (Jas 4:9). Humility must express appropriate sorrow for "sin". The sin, that use to be fun and brighten our day, must now ruin our days. It must make us feel absolutely terrible. That cannot happen unless we realize "sin" will condemn us to hell; therefore, it is a serious matter. Only then will we be like the tax collector, a man so sorrowful for his sins, he would not even look up to heaven, but instead wailed, "God, be merciful to me a sinner" (Lk 18:13).

Finally, James concludes by saying, "Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up" (Jas 4:10). Humility must acknowledge the sight of the Lord. The Psalmist and the prodigal son recognized that they had sinned against God and heaven (Psa 51:4; Lk 15:18). God is primarily the One against whom our sins are committed; God is the only One who can pardon our sins. When we recognize it helps to bring about humility. God gives grace to the humble. While men repeatedly sin against Him, God joyfully accepts those who take action and come to Him in repentance (Lk 15:22-24). The way to heaven is to realize our sins and shortcomings are humbly depending upon the will of an ALL-powerful God for our eternal salvation.

There are four conditions which we must fulfill, if God is to have full possession:

- 1. We must be subject to the will of God (Jas 4:7).
- 2. We must draw nigh to God (Jas 4:8).
- 3. We must cleanse our hands and purify our hearts (Jas 4:9).
- 4. We must humble ourselves in His sight (Jas 4:10).


Then God will fill the soul, the sluice gates of which are open to Him.
